



Provisional Driver Event Confirmation

Congratulations on meeting the requirements for a VRG Provisional or Novice Provisional Competition License which allows you to enter and race in any VRG event. If you plan to race with other clubs, you will need to contact them in advance to determine if their rules allow you to enter their events with your VRG Provisional or Novice Provisional Competition License.

As a holder of a VRG Novice Provisional Competition License you are required to apply "Novice Stripes" to the rear of the car per VRG Rule 1.3.3. If you are planning to run with another club be sure to contact them in advance to determine their Novice Stripe requirements.

This Provisional Driver Event Confirmation (PDEC) is a record of your successful incident-free participation in three VRG race events as well as successful completion of a number of "Worker Experience" activities which will be assigned to you by the Chief Steward.

The table below on this page is a record of your Worker experience activities at VRG events. Worker experience assignments are intended to give you increased awareness of what happens “behind the scenes” on a race weekend to make the sport safer for you and your fellow racers.

The worker experience requirement is designed to have you as a Provisional driver work an assigned specialty an average of one session per race event day for each of three VRG events for a total of nine sessions worked before being eligible for a VRG Competition License. The timing of this is flexible; if you cannot get three session in one event for some reason you can catch up later. If you are super ambitious and want to do them all in one weekend that’s fine, too. The main thing is you need to get experience in three of racing’s most critical operational specialties, Flagging, Emergency Services and Pit/Grid/Black-Flag. The exact mix of the nine sessions for you will be decided by the VRG Chief Steward after talking with you. At a minimum you will do two sessions in each of the three critical specialties with the remaining sessions to be determined. Your worker experience sessions will be scheduled so as not to conflict with your regular on track race sessions.

Successful participation in the worker experience means that you will arrive on-station at least 10 minutes prior to the start of the session and remain until the session is over and all cars have returned to the paddock. While on-station you will be expected to perform various tasks which are related to the duties of the specialty and are within your abilities. This may require a briefing or some training by the station captain or specialty chief; discuss this with the VRG Chief Steward.

Before you leave the event be sure to check in with the VRG Chief Steward to get signed-off and retrieve this PDEC.
